



## NEWS POLICIES CHANGES FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES

**Tulsa, OK July 12, 2016 :** "WE THE PEOPLE OKLAHOMA" continues to work on behalf of the people to keep our elected officials accountable to those they vowed to serve. In light of the recent events that have occurred around the county and in Oklahoma, we are requesting a meeting with law enforcement officials and the immediate implementation of certain policy changes in the various departments. We believe changes need to occur in the relationship between law enforcement and the public to ensure trust, transparency, and safety. Below we have outlined three policy changes that the Tulsa County Sheriff Office and Tulsa Police Department can immediately implement to continue to improve the relationship with people they have vowed to serve.

First, all TPD and TCSO policies should be online and accessible to the general public. The policies that each officer must abide by should be available for all citizens to read and understand. Second, all officers involved in shootings should have a blood test taken along with a psychiatric evaluation immediately. Most employers require tests after an incident occurs on the job. Our law enforcement departments should do the same. Not only should this be a requirement in all departments but our state legislators should propose a bill to make this into law. Third, when police reports are revised, all of the versions should be accessible to see what changes were made and why.

"WE THE PEOPLE OKLAHOMA" will continue to push for transparency and accountability from our public officials. We continue to work on behalf of the citizens of the great state of Oklahoma because when concerned citizens make their voices heard positive changes can be made.
